Michael Sees was successful in every aspect of his life. He had a wonderful wife, two well-loved little girls, many friends, and an incredible career ahead of him. Michael was also a member of the Texas Wesleyan Law Review, and we will miss him deeply.

Michael graduated in 1984 from the University of Notre Dame with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering, and in 1990 from the University of Texas in Arlington with a Master of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. He was a Registered Professional Engineer and also a Registered Patent Agent. Michael was working part time for Thompson & Knight in Dallas and was also assisting his father-in-law with his patent law practice. He was expecting to receive his Jurisprudence Doctorate from Texas Wesleyan University School of Law in December of 1998 and was in the top ten percent of his class.

On the way to his patent law final exam last summer, Michael was killed in an automobile accident through the fault of another driver. The news shocked and saddened us all. We dedicate this issue to the memory of Michael and to his wife, Jennifer, and their daughters, Holly and Mackenzie.
